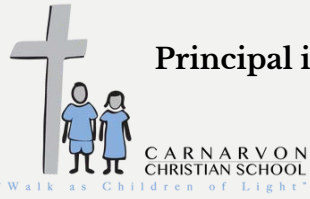

We are a family school community and the school of choice in the Carnarvon area according to our increasing enrolments.



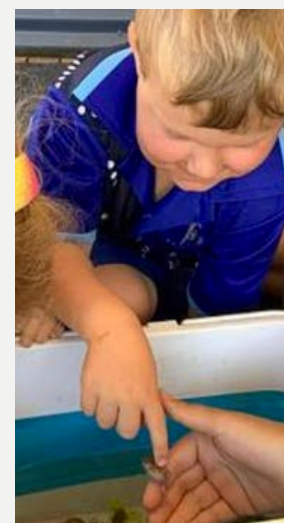
The school motto is:

When the Geraldton Christian College payed us a visit Year 1 had lots of fun with Science, Sport and Arts activities.

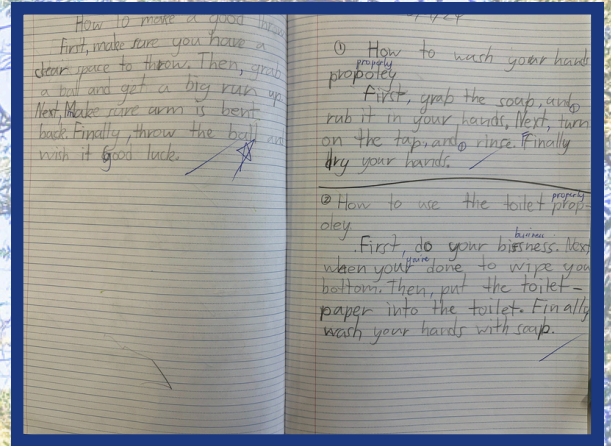

YEAR 2/3 REPORT



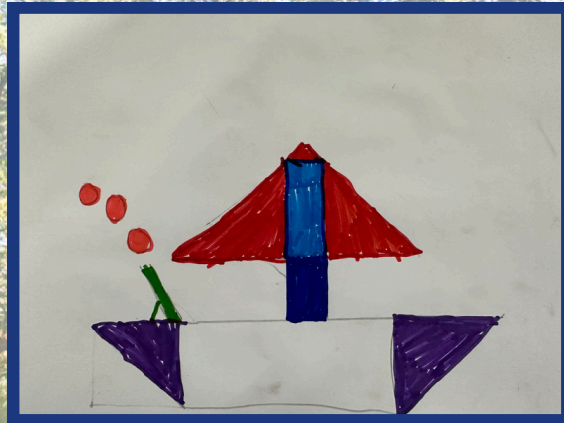
The Year 2 and 3 class had an amazing time with Mr. Glenn Swift during his visit for the Book Week celebration. His animated story telling really captured our kids' attention.

We also learned about Impressionism. These are some of our artworks.






Some snapshots during our Faction carnival practice and the event itself. It was a blast!!!




As we step into the month of September, it's a perfect time to reflect on all the exciting activities our students have experienced recently and share what's coming up!




