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

Fundamental Movement Skills

Each day in Pre-primary we take time for fitness and movement. Our focus for term 4 is jumping, kicking and balance. The students enjoy moving their bodies through skill drills and games.









Nifty Numeracy

The children in Preprimary are enthusiastic about numeracy. To begin term 4 learning has been focused on 3 dimensional shapes and fractions. Students have developed an understanding of shape properties such as curved and flat as well as objects that stack or roll. The children are developing foundation fraction knowledge by identifying the difference between whole and part.

Honing our Skills in Numeracy



We incorporate our lessons in Numeracy with our daily activities in school from line formation skip counting to our mat activities calendar activity. We also have our daily skills test wherein we focus on one operation to work on. Our 5-minute mental math is for the review of the previous lessons, so they won't forget it. Repetition and practicing daily math are two of the most important components in learning mathematical concepts.

Targeting our Skills in Literacy

These last two terms, we are using The Reading Comprehension Box as one of our activities in Literacy that involves reading, listening and answering questions based from the text read. These set of texts feature both fiction and nonfiction texts incorporating Society and Environment, Science, and Health and Values topics, which enables them to be exposed from a wide range of genre and school subjects. This activity also makes the children develop more their concentration and focus in class. Moreover, they are excited to answer the questions and check their answers afterwards.



Auslan

The children are doing really well with their Auslan especially in signing "Our Father." Since we also incorporate Auslan in our daily lessons, they find it more meaningful and useful. Consistently practicing it makes it easier for us to adapt / learn this form of communication.
